- (b) A factory owner employs 11-year-old children in his factory
- (c) A person is arrested by police, kept in custody for 30 days, and not produced before a magistrate
- (d) A state government orders that only members of one religion can apply for a particular government job [4 marks]

Q2. Why are Directive Principles of State Policy not legally enforceable like Fundamental Rights? Despite this, explain FOUR ways in which DPSPs have been effective in shaping Indian law and governance. [4 marks]
